put it into bottles or jars and pour over it some boiling white wine vinegar, with sugar and spice to taste. When cold, cork tightly.
Keep a long nail near the laundry tubs and use it to remove the rubber stoppers instead of chains. The nail serves as a lever.
When the fragrance of a balsam jar pillow seems to be fading, hold the pillow over the steam of a tea kettle, and it will be restored.
There is to be had a combination brush, scraper and self-wringing mop, all on a long handle, which is a wonderful help in scrubbing floors.
Grease stains on leather may be removed by benzine or pure turpentine. Wash the spot afterward with beaten white of egg or a kid reviver.
A good recipe for collars and cuffs is five teaspoonfuls of starch, one quart of water, one teaspoonful of borax and one teaspoonful of lard or paraffin. Have the water boiling, place the starch, borax and fat in the starch kettle and stir in enough cold water to make a smooth paste. Then add the boiling water and cook till thoroughly clear. Strain and use hot.
To shrink washing materials, keep our material in the same creases as when bought, opened only enough to lie easily in the bottom of the bathtub. Run enough water in the tub to cover the goods and leave for a sufficient time to be thoroughly shrunken. Then lay the broom across the tub and carefully hang the material upon it. Let it drain in the tub and dry.

An Anglo-Negro Composer.

"Mr. Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, one of the foremost of English musical composers of the present day, has just died. He was in his 38th year."
"Mr. Coleridge-Taylor, whose most famous composition is his cantata 'Hiawatha', to the music of which a part of Longfellow's poem is set, was of mixed racial origin," says the Telegraph. "His father was a West African negro, who practised as a doctor at Croydon, and who married an Englishwoman. Displaying a high order of musical talent as a boy, he learned to play the violin, and at the age of ten joined the choir of St. George's, Croydon. Later, as an alto, he sang in the choir of St. Mary Magdalene, Croydon. In 1881 he entered the Royal College of Music, Kensington, with the intention of becoming a violinist. Finding, however, that he was more attracted by composition, he gave up the violin and devoted himself to creative work."
"The sudden death of Mr. Coleridge-Taylor at the age of thirty-seven will be felt as a serious loss by all who are interested in musical matters," says the Times. "It is not only that his career as a composer was begun with exceptional brilliance, but in many other directions, as a conductor, as a teacher, and more especially as an adjudicator at important competitive choral festivals, his activities have been exceedingly valuable."
"Samuel Coleridge-Taylor was born on August 15, 1875; his father was a native of Sierra Leone and his mother an Englishwoman. His mixed descent cannot be forgotten in any study of his music, since it makes his work an interesting example to all who are concerned with the appearance of racial characteristics in music. For in any work which one may take up it is obvious at once that it has certain features in its melody, style of treatment, and use of orchestral colour which distinguish it at once from the music of English composers."
