THE PACKAGE WAS SHIPPED AT DORCHESTER, ENGLAND, FOR ROTTERDAM.

London, Dec. 13.-The German army officer whom the customs officials at Gravesend Saturday found concealed in a huge box to Rotterdam. told an alien emigration officer that was a lieutenant in the German Army, according to a despatch from Gravesend to Lloyd's News.
