MONNTENEGRINS MAKE DETER-MINED STAND.

Serbia, according to the Athens correspondent of the Daily Mail. The correspondent states that Germany has offered to extend Serbian boundaries in the direction of Bosnia and Herzegovania and re-establish the kingdom under Austria-German suzerainty with Prince Eitel Frederich, Emperor William's second son on the Serbian throne.
