In these notes (Thoughts upon the Times) written last December, the writer pointed out that Germany's policy then seemed to be to get possession of Russia from Petrograd to Odesa.

Supposing that Germany has to relinquish all the territory which she now occupies in France, Belgium, Serbia and Roumania, and also relinquish all her colonies now in possession of the Allies, she will be in a large measure more powerful than she was before the war began.

The supreme test of the manhood of the Empire is about to be ushered in. Shall we be able to withstand it. In a speech recently made by Sir Auckland Geddes, the new Minister of National Service, we get the following facts relating to the contributions of man-power from the different parts of the Empire.

Breadcrumb-griddle cakes are delicious served with maple syrup. A paint brush makes a nice brush for putting on stove polish. Run lard through the meat grinder instead of cutting it up by hand.
