### The Herring Situation.

Clouds of misunderstanding appear to be dissipating in Newfoundland among the herring packers, and it is entirely likely that the high prices now being asked will be lowered as a result of sane reasoning out of the matter. Newfoundland newspapers are discussing the subject and endeavoring to point out to fishermen and packers that this is not the time to extort high prices from buyers who have been instrumental to a very large extent in the development of the industry. The "Trade Review" of St. John's, commenting upon the present situation, says: "It is time that the Government through the Marine and Fisheries Department, should step in to control this herring business in the interests of the fishermen themselves and in order that the fishery be not ruined. New York is not dependent this winter solely on Newfoundland herring. Thirty thousand barrels are now on the way from British Columbia, and the Scotch and the Dutch will also be sending over herring very soon. The extraordinary prices that importers of Newfoundland herring in New York will have to look for to make the venture pay will militate seriously against the sale of our herring this winter and there will be ruin and loss to individuals and a black eye to our herring trade." It

might be added that Newfoundland is not likely to sell through New York at all at the prices which are at present being asked. The packers must know by now that New York importers do not intend to venture into the Newfoundland Scotch cured market until the packers can see more than one viewpoint.—Editorial N. Y. Fishing Gazette.

### North Sydney Murder Case.

Sydney, N.S., Dec. 20.—The arrest of Patrolman Dunphy of the North Sydney police force, is the latest development in the McDonald murder case. Dunphy was arrested in Magistrate Hearn's office on a charge of robbery with violence and was allowed to go on bail of \$5,000. Dunphy was told that he was wanted and came over to Sydney where he was placed under arrest. He will appear before Magistrate Hearn in the near future.

### Big Codfish For Wilson

A 24-pound codfish, caught of Nan-tucket by the steam trawler Fish Hawk, was shipped from Boston on Thursday to Paris as a gift to President Wilson for his New Year's dinner. It is the largest codfish that has been brought into the market here recently.

President I. M. Taylor, of the East Coast Fisheries Company, who is sending it to the President, said it would be taken to Bordeaux by the steamer La Touraine, sailing from New York, and thence by special messenger to Paris.

Mr. Taylor added that the gift was an expression of appreciation of the action of the President in issuing priority orders which permitted the construction of the steam trawlers Kingfisher and Fish Hawk during the war. The Kingfisher was sunk by a German submarine—N.Y. Fishing Gazette.

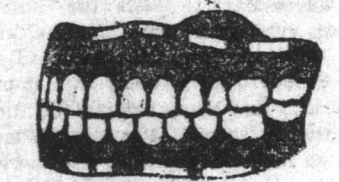
