INFLUENZA JAUNDICE.

WARSAW, March 2. A new kind of influenza, with complication of jaundice, has made its appearance in Poland. The disease is particularly virulent along eastern borders, where refugees are pouring in by thousands daily from Russia. The mortality rate is high.

POLITICAL COMPLICATIONS.

LONDON, March 2. Either an early general election or the resignation of Premier Lloyd George will be the upshot of the present political crisis, it is generally believed. The apparently widening breach in the Conservative party, together with a consistent gain in the strength of the Liberals, under former Premier Asquith, and Laborites, as evidenced in recent bye-elections, have forced these alternatives on the Premier. Mr. Lloyd George is understood to have served notice in his letter to J. Austen Chamberlain that Sir George Younger, leader of the Conservative secessionists, who recently attacked the Premier in the House of Commons, must go or he will step down from office. Sir George Younger's tactics have met with disfavor among a considerable section of the party, especially with Mr. Chamberlain and Lord Chancellor Birkenhead, the latter publicly voicing his disapproval in a recent speech. In this connection some significance is attached to a report that Younger may resign from the House and be elevated to the peerage.

Women Smugglers in Big Liners.

Smuggling by passengers and others arriving at Southampton in the big liners from the United States and South Africa, and in steamers plying between that port and the Continent, is increasing to such an extent that the Customs officials are experiencing the greatest difficulty in dealing with it, says the Daily Mail. A warehouse at the docks is congested with a great medley of seized goods. Crates and loose bottles of choice liquors, champagne, and perfume from France are piled high amid motor parts, films and watches from the United States, and in huge cupboards are stacked crates of cigars, cigarettes, and tobacco. Other cupboards contain glittering arrays of bottled whisky, brandy, rum, and gin, the original owners of which had attempted to smuggle them into the United States. Some of this haul was detected and sent back to Southampton from New York, but much of it was stopped in ships about to sail from Southampton.

Mr. A. W. Scarlett, waterguard superintendent at Southampton, says: "The smuggling is far worse than before the war, because the very much increased duties make it a far greater temptation. The running of spirits to America has become particularly serious. It seems to be quite a trade. The shipping companies are doing all they can to help us to stop it, for they themselves are heavily fined if spirits are found coming off their vessels."

Bottles of champagne have been discovered carried in baggy trousers. One man recently searched had a foreign watch in each of his ten pockets. Women are often far more daring than men in trying to evade the Customs. The carrying of bottles of scent in their bosoms is a favourite practice.

Bluebeard in the Flesh.

French annals state that "Bluebeard" (Gilles de Laval, Seigneur de Retz), said one to have been Marshal of France—a successful military commander, commenced, when 37 years of age, the horrible course of living which brought infamy on his name. Through inheritance he became the richest subject in France. But his great fortune was the cause of his ruin. Forsaking the old way of life, he plunged into a course of debauchery and profligacy which rapidly diminished his wealth. It is said he maintained a guard of honor of 200 horsemen, and his suite (of 50 persons) comprised chaplains, choristers, musicians, pages and servants, most of whom were accomplices. Yet he affected great pomp and magnificence in religious ceremonies. His chancel was hung with cloth of gold and silk, the sacred vessels were of gold and enriched with precious stones. His chaplains were clothed in scarlet robes adorned with fur, and bore the titles of dean, archbishop and bishop, and he even went the length of sending a deputy to the Pope to ask permission to have a cross carried before him. The lives he sacrificed were those of children. In the majority of cases the bodies were burned, but the remains of more than 125 victims were found, but how many all together came to their death at his hands was never clearly known.

Where It's Always Cold.

There has been no other invention in the world that has become so much used in so short a time as the refrigerator.

To-day we could not live without it, for our immense system of food transport is based on the cold-storage principle.

Cold-storage rooms are fitted in all food ships. These rooms are specially constructed to prevent heat passing in from outside, their walls being partly hollow, and partly filled with sawdust or glass-wool.

The room is made cold by means of a system of iron pipes fixed to the roof. A refrigerating machine pumps cold brine—a mixture of salt and water—through the pipes, keeping the liquid at a temperature of about ten degrees below freezing point.

When the cold-storage room has been filled for the voyage, the doors are shut, and are not opened again until the ship reaches its destination. Before the doors are shut a search is always made round the compartment to see that no one is left inside, for once the door is closed it is impossible to hear any sound through the double walls.

On one occasion a stowaway hid in one of the stores, not knowing it was a refrigerator, and probably thinking it an excellent place to hide in. He was not found until six weeks later, frozen to death, looking like a wax figure.

Fruit, such as apples, is never frozen, but stored at a temperature two degrees above freezing point. The moisture in the fruit would freeze, you see, and as it swelled it would burst the fruit. Then when it thawed, the fruit would collapse to mush.

The atmosphere in the room is a dense white fog due to the moisture in the air solidifying and floating about. Sometimes the fog settles out, and the whole place is suddenly subjected to a miniature snowstorm.
