

The lumber trade of the Ottawa is said to be seriously affected by the prevailing stringency in the money market. The Roman Catholic Bishop's palace in London had a narrow escape from being burned on Thursday night, owing to a defective flue.

Some teeth and bones of an extinct species of animal have been found at Millbrooks. They are pronounced by Mr. J. B. Dixon, of the College Institute of Peterboro', to be those of an extinct species of elephant, probably *elephas Americanus*. One of the teeth, though imperfect, weighs 6 lbs. 5 oz.

Mr. C. Blackett Robinson, publisher of the *British American Presbyterian*, has leased the building lately occupied by the *Daily Telegraph*, and is fitting it up for the purpose of a first-class printing office. He has purchased two large steam presses and several other presses, as well as a stereotype apparatus. The office will be one of the best in the Dominion.

THE NISSOURI MURDER.—The trial of the prisoner, Thomas Coyle, is expected will take place on Tuesday, 3th of October, at the fall assizes, and will, no doubt, cause quite a sensation. Kenneth McKenzie, Q.C., assisted by Mr. Warren Rook, will prosecute on behalf of the crown. Mr. D. Glass will defend the prisoner. Coyle is as taciturn as ever and never alludes to the crime.

CHEESE SHOW AND FAIR.—The Ontario Dairymen's Association have taken a most important step in resolving to hold a cheese fair and show, at which the sum of \$500 will be offered in premiums. The Show will be held in the Agricultural Hall, Belleville, on the 15th and 16th of October next, and we hope will result in a lively competition. There will be two classes. Class A comprises six prizes for the best three factory cheeses made at any time during the year 1872. In Class B six prizes are offered for the best four factory cheeses—two made during the month of September, 1872—each cheese to be of a different day's make. The competition has been wisely opened to all factories in Ontario.

The attempt of California to acclimatize the Cashmere goat promises success, the animal attaining a larger size and yielding a finer fleece than in its native India. There are estimated to be forty thousand Cashmires in the State, and the fleece, according to grade, is worth from twenty-five cents up to one dollar and twenty-five cents per pound.


