VERMONT CENTRAL TRAINS COLLIDED. Montreal Express Crashes Into a Freight Train-Two Employes Hurt. South Royalton, Vt., Dec. 27. -Several persons were injured here today in a head-on collision on the Vermont Railroad between a Montreal express bound from Boston and a freight train. Several of the freight cars were forced from the rails in the collision and wrecked. All traffic over the road was suspended for several hours.

CAUSES MUCH TROUBLE. Horton Street Water Main Broken - Four Times Since Sunday. The break in the water main on Horton street, between Talbot and Richmond streets, has caused much trouble since Sunday. The water has been put in so that it can be cut off immediately a leak occurs.
