TAILORS AGGRIEVED

Special to The Advertiser by a Staff Correspondent, Ottawa, Dec. 12.—Representatives of the Retail Merchants' Association of Canada, some 50 strong, are in the capital today urging upon Hon. Jacques Bureau, minister of customs, the desirability of suspending the new sales tax regulations, which go into force January 1. Under these regulations retail merchant tailors are virtually classified as marufac-

turers and are required to charge the 6 per cent sales tax to the customer on the finished article. At present the tax is paid on the material purchased at the port of entry. To this, the delegation informed the minister, they had no objection.

Under the new regulations they stated there was practically a reversion to the much-hated luxury tax as vented upon the devoted head of

It was pointed out that under the new regulations, the cost of labor and overhead was taxed as well as the goods used. In addition much bookkeeping was involved. It was bookkeeping was involved. It was hard enough to do business now without offending the customer by direct taxation. The delegation was backed by telegrams and resolutions from every part of the Dominion.

The minister promised consideration of the representations of the

delegation. Tomorrow a delegation represent-ing the furriers of Canada will meet Mr. Bureau and make representations practically along the same lines.


