An interesting paper on Russian agriculture, recently issued, shows clearly that agricultural depression is not confined by the boundaries of nations or of continents, or by the restrictions or freedom of fiscal policies. The change from a high range of prices to a range of low and moderate values, consequent on large production and greater facilities of transport, is affecting all countries effice. The cheap and primitive grain growing of Russia is no exception, for agriculture is in a most depressed condition, and grain production has not paid, although the 1836 and 1257 crops were generally good. It costs in Russian about \$5.10 to cultivate an acre of wheat, and the average production is about \$5 bushels per acre. In 1857 wheat brought only 63 cents per bushel, which gives a raturn of \$6.35 per acre, or \$5 cants per acre profit.


