In May, 1883, Port Arthur was incorporated as a town, and at once began to gain in presumence and importances and its growth and property ever since have been simply remarkable. This is of course mainly due to the following causes: the opening up of the great Canadian Pactific Railway—the establishment of regular lines of steamers, and the extending of the great muning interests, combined with new discoveries and the development of the several rich alver mines.
