BETTER TONE TO MARKETS.

NEW YORK SPECULATORS ARE MUCH BOUNCER.

Local Stocks Quiet, With Canadian Favorites Higher-Moderate Decrease in Wheat Values and Good Decrease in Passeng-Cars and Provisions Higher in Chicago-Cotton Fall.

New fall wheat is now offering at western points in Ontario. It is worth about one cent more than the hard times which seem likely to come upon us next winter.

Canadian Pacific strong to-day, with sales in New York, Montreal and Toronto at 65, and closing at 67 1/2 in London, an advance of 1/2.

The amount of gold in the United States treasury is \$24,223,000, as compared with \$24,000,000 a year ago.

The wheat crop in Hungary is estimated at 185,500,000 bushels and 775,000,000 bushels.

The amount of wheat stored in Europe is 33,000,000 bushels, a decrease of 1,192,000 for the week. A year ago the amount stored was 32,300,000 bushels.

Corn stored in Europe: 5,928,000 bushels, an increase of 176,000 bushels for the week.

Imports into the United Kingdom the past week: Wheat, 350,000 qrs.; maize, 235,000 qrs.; flour, 184,000 barrels.

Loans and discounts of New York banks aggregate \$482,700,000, as against \$413,400,000 a year ago. The deposits amount to \$350,034,000 as compared with \$294,174,000 a year ago.

The exports of cattle at Montreal last week were 4221 head, and of sheep 4745. The total exports of cattle this season to date 23,434, as against 40,119 the same period last year. Sheep exports aggregate 252,133 this season, as against only 406 head during same period last year.
