ENTERPRISE SHOWN
IN TRADE JUBILEE

Kentville Merchants End Successful Contest With Big Prize Drawing And Band Concert.

Kentville—Four thousand people packed Court House Square tonight for the drawing of three prize winners in Kentville mammoth trade jubilee which has been on for the past two weeks. The winners were: 1st prize, \$400 plane, Edward Kelly, of Brooklyn street, Kings County; 2nd prize, \$150 range, Bruce Carroll, of the D. A. R., Kentville; 3rd prize, electric piano lamp, Miss Blanche Fullerton, of Parrsboro, who is attending school in Kentville.

The sale was the most successful ever put on in this town, 48,500 tickets being given away for cash purchases, representing the same amount in money taken in. Thirty-seven merchants took part in the sale, all contributing towards the prizes. To Tom Weaver, Kentville merchant, goes the credit for staging the sale.

The contest ended with a concert by the Kentville Citizens Band, which entertained the biggest crowd that has ever been in Kentville. Combining delegates to the big convention of the United Fruit Growers Companies and the Baptist Convention, and those present for the contest. The judges of the contest were Hon. John A. McDonald, M.P.P., Upper Dyke Village; Caleb Bill, of Bellows; and Deputy Mayor J. W. DeWolfe, of Kentville. J. Roy Hills, of Kentville, was announcer. Only one drawing for each prize was necessary, all present winners being present.
