- Sisiquoi, perhaps for, sisikwa, rattlesnake.
- SKOWHEGAN, (Abenakis), from skuahigen, or skwahigen, it is pointed.
- SACO is believed to come from sok8ai, (old Abenakis), which means: from the South side; Southern. Hence the name sok8aki, (modern, sokoki), Southern country; Southern people, or better, Indians from the South.
- SAGUENAY RIVER is called by the Micmars "Ktadoosôk", flowing between two high steep cliffs.
- ST JOHN, N. B., (Micmac), Menawges, where they collect the dead seals.
- SUNCOOK, (Abenakis), from senikok, at the rocks.
- TENNESSEE, (Ind.), river of the Big Bend (N. S. Dictionary.)
- TADOUSSAC, (Cree), from, totosak plural of totos, woman's breast, pap. (Otchip. gramm.)
- TEMISCOUATA, it is deep every where, from, timiv, it is deep in the water, and, iskwatam without end (Otchip. gramm.)
- UMBAGOG, (Ind.) clear lake, shallow. (N. S. Dictionary.)
- WACHUSETT, (Abenakis) from, wajos, a mountain (of middling height), and the prepositive termination ek, which represents the preposition at: at the mountain.
