

SISQUOI, perhaps for, *sisikwa*, rattlesnake.

SKOWHEGAN, (Abenakis), from *skuahigen*, or *skwahigen*, it is pointed.

SACO is believed to come from *sok8ai*, (old Abenakis), which means : from the South side ; Southern. Hence the name *sok8aki*, (modern, *sokoki*), Southern country ; Southern people, or better, Indians from the South.

SAGUENAY RIVER is called by the *Micmacs* " Ktadoosôk ", flowing between two high steep cliffs.

ST JOHN, N. B., (Micmac), *Mènaugès*, where they collect the dead seals.

SUNCOOK, (Abenakis), from *senikok*, at the rocks.

TENNESSEE, (Ind.), river of the Big Bend (*N. S. Dictionary.*)

TADOUSSAC, (Cree), from, *totosak* plural of *tôlôc*, woman's breast, pap. (*Otchip. gramm.*)

TEMISCOUATA, it is deep every where, from, *timiw*, it is deep in the water, and, *iskwatâm* without end (*Otchip. gramm.*)

UMBAGOG, (Ind.) clear lake, shallow. (*N. S. Dictionary.*)

WACHUSETT, (Abenakis) from, *wajos*, a mountain (of middling height), and the *prepositive* termination *ek*, which represents the preposition *at* : at the mountain.
