The supplies have been considerable for this season of the year, not only at this point, but at various other important stations on the railways. The enquiry for all kinds of grain continues active, but for articles for family use, the supply has been in excess of the demand, and the prices have been low, with a declining tendency. a declining tendence.

Flora has not been much traded in during the riora has not been much traided in during the week, the offerings being small with the farmers, on the part of holders sufficient to prevent transactions. Buyers are not anxious to operate except they can get a good largain and run less risk than if they paid the extreme rates asked by holders. There have been us asless within the past few days of sufficient importance on which to base quotations, and the following figures must be regarded more as the rates named respectively by buyers and sollers, than a reign which would either be accepted or tealized Double Extra, \$6.40 to \$6.75; Extra, \$6.to \$6.25; Fall when, Pancy, \$5.75, and spring wheat, Fancy, \$5.50; Superfine No. 1, \$5.10 to \$5.15, per

WHEAT has been freely offered during the week, and for this season of the year the transactions have been large. The quality of the delireries has been large. The quanty of the heliveries has been pretty good, except on Tuesday, when it was rather lower than usual, yet the only sample of the week is equal to that of previous weeks. There has been and still is an active compelitive demand between buyers, but the depressing advices which continue to be received. depressing advices which continue in the received from abroad has checked prices, and close slightly lower than on this day work. The best grades on Tuesday realized \$1.25 to \$1.40, the latter in one or two cases only; while the bulk of the dallveries were got at between \$1.25 to \$1.25—the average price of the day not being over \$1.35 per bushel. The receipts of both fall and spring wheat amounted to nearly 4000 bushels. Spring wheat sold at \$1.05 to \$1.12\frac{1}{2}—the current outside figure being \$1.10 per bushel.
