The House has taken fourteen days to come to a decision. The decision is in favour of Lord Falkland's view of Colonial Government. The division which took place on the evening of the fourth day, was as follows:—For the Address, 24; for the amendment, 22.

VIGOR.—The Vice-President of the Executive Council, arrived in this city yesterday, by his country coach, where two very numerous meetings have been held during the four days that Mr. Vigor spent there; one at St. Urs and one at St. Denis, at which were assembled the electors from different parts of the county, whom the hon. Member was received with most enthusiastic applause. We shall not record word more on the subject; facts speak for themselves.—Montreal Aurora.
