ARTICLE 14.

The present Convention shall come into force on the ninetieth day following the receipt by the Secretary-General of the League of Nations of ratifications or accessions on behalf of not less than ten Members of the League of Nations or non-member States

ARTICLE 15.

Ratifications or accessions received after the entry into force of the Copies in accessions received after the entry into force of the vention in accordance with Article 14 shall take effect as from the ninetieth day following the date of their receipt by the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.

ARTICLE 16.

After the expiration of five years from the coming into force of the present Convention in accordance with Article 14, it may be denounced by an instrument in writing, denosited with the Scorete Convention. ment in writing, deposited with the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.
