## ARTICLE 8

## Prior Consent for Enrichment and Reprocessing of Nuclear Material

- 1. Each Party shall obtain the written consent of the other Party prior to the enrichment of any nuclear material subject to this Agreement to 20 percent or more in the isotope U 235 or to the reprocessing of any nuclear material subject to this Agreement. The other Party shall not unreasonably withhold its consent and shall endeavour to make its decision as expeditiously as possible.
- 2. To facilitate the implementation of paragraph 1, the Parties shall enter into other agreements to establish the conditions under which nuclear material subject to this Agreement is reprocessed or enriched to 20 percent or more in the isotope U 235 as well as the conditions under which the resultant plutonium or uranium enriched to 20 percent or more may be stored, transferred, and used.

## ARTICLE 9

## Safeguards

- 1. Nuclear material, material, equipment, and technology subject to this Agreement shall not be used for, or diverted to, the manufacture, development, testing, detonation or acquisition of nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices.
- With respect to nuclear material, the obligation referred to in paragraph 1 shall be verified pursuant to the safeguards agreements between each Party and the IAEA, in connection with the NPT. For Canada, this means the Agreement between the Government of Canada and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards in Connection with the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, done at Vienna on 21 February 1972, and the Protocol Additional to the Agreement between Canada and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards in Connection with the Treaty on Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, done at Vienna on 24 September 1998. For the United Arab Emirates, this means the Agreement between the United Arab Emirates and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards in Connection with the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, done at Abu Dhabi on 15 December 2002, and the Protocol Additional to the Agreement between the United Arab Emirates and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards in Connection with the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, done at Vienna on 8 April 2009. The Parties shall apply these safeguard agreements to all nuclear material subject to this Agreement.
