PRAYERS.

On motion of Mr. Bennett, it was resolved,—That when this House rises for an extended adjournment of the present session, it stand adjourned until Monday, the 30th of January, 1933, at three o'clock in the afternoon.

On motion of Mr. Bennett, it was resolved,—That this House shall be adjourned at 6 o'clock, p.m., on Thursday, November 17th instant, and shall meet at 10.30 a.m., on Friday, the 18th instant, and that the provision of Standing Order No. 2 with regard to the time for the meeting of the House be suspended in relation thereto.

Mr. Gordon, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copies of Orders in Council passed under the provisions of the Unemployment and Farm Relief Continuance Act, 1932, as follows:—

Order in Council, P.C. 2479, dated 11th November, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Nova Scotia of \$1,449.42 for public works and undertakings.

Order in Council, P.C. 2480, dated 11th November, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Quebec of \$3,528.88 for public works and undertakings.

Order in Council, P.C. 2481, dated 11th November, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Quebec of \$6,953.44 for direct relief.

Order in Council, P.C. 2482, dated 11th November, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Ontario of \$90,691.18 for direct relief distributed in certain municipalities and unorganized districts and \$426.60 for direct relief disbursed by the Ontario Navy League.

Order in Council, P.C. 2483, dated 11th November, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Alberta of \$1,141.68 for direct relief.
