PIPE LINES

TRANS-CANADA PIPE LINES—REQUEST FOR TABLING OF AGREEMENTS

Hon. George A. Drew (Leader of the Opposition): Mr. Speaker, before the Prime Minister moves the adjournment I wish to direct a question to him through you. In view of the inclusion in the speech from the throne of a reference to the trans-Canada pipe line, I wonder whether the Prime Minister could make arrangements for the tabling tomorrow of the draft agreement between the government of Canada and the government of the province of Ontario as well as the draft agreement between the proposed crown company and Trans-Canada Pipe Lines Limited.

Right Hon. L. S. St. Laurent (Prime Minister): I will endeavour to ascertain if those documents can be tabled tomorrow.
