Sir Charles Tupper moved, that The House do resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole, to-morrow, to consider a certain proposed Resolution to grant certain subsidies to Railway Companies, therein mentioned.

Whereupon Sir Charles Tupper informed The House, that His Excellency the Governor General having been made aware of the subject matter of the said Resolu-

tion, recommends it to The House.

And a Debate arising on the motion ;-

Mr. Bergin moved, that the Debate be adjourned; -which was negatived.

And the question being put; it was agreed to.

Ordered,—That The House do resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole, to-morrow, to consider the said Resolution.

A Message was received from the Senate, agreeing to the Bill No. 118 to amend the Act incorporating the European, American, Canadian and Asiatic Cable Company (Limited), and to change the name thereof to "The American, British and Continental Cable Company (Limited)," without amendment.

The amendments made by the Senate to the Bill No. 115 to consolidate and amend the several Acts respecting the Inland Revenue, were taken into consideration, and concurred in.

The Bill No. 129 to amend the Act 38 Victoria, Chapter 56, intituled: "An Act respecting the Graving Dock in the Harbour of Quebec, and authorizing the raising of a loan in respect thereof," was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported, read a third time, and passed.

The Bill No. 130 to amend the Act 36 Victoria, Chapter 62, and the Act 43 Victoria, Chapter 17, respecting the Quebec Harbour Commissioners, was read a second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, amended, reported, considered as amended, agreed to, read a third time, and passed.

And The House having continued to sit after 12 of the clock, midnight;

FRIDAY, 18TH MAY, 1883.

The Resolutions Nos. 308, 309, 310 and 326, reported from the Committee of Supply, on the 15th instant, and postponed, were taken into consideration; and the question of concurrence thereon being severally put,—they were agreed to.

The House then adjourned at 12.25 A.M.
