Memorandum to Mr. Glassco;

Re School for Teachers: I am afraid the budget for this School must stand, unless a cut is made in Teachers' Salaries.

The appropriations call for about \$3000/andition to the Salaries, one-t hird of which is made up of a charge of \$5 for laboratory fees. We have doubled this fee, making it \$10 per student, which means that the student will pay two-thirds of the cost of running the School outside the Teachers' Salaries. We are predluded from charging fees by the legal agreement we have with the Protestant Commission.

Next year a laboratory fee for intermediate students will be \$10.00 and for these in the elementary class \$5 00.

School of Household Science: I am enclosing hereithh budget, which is, I think, about the best that can be done.
