too hastily it may call the Panacea of all those evils which afflict this country. Let me be indulged with a candid hearing, and it shall shortly appear that I am not wont to gloss over evils or abuses of any kind; and I trust that the tenor of my past converfations and avowed principles will stamp me a warm friend to the general liberties of mankind, and to my particular rights as an Englishman; with respect to suture conduct - unhappily, the hour of proof may be at no great distance! the honourable gentleman has repeatedly called the attention of the house to the principle of his bill,—the restriction of that undue influence which raises the crown so high on the felf-debasement of parliament.—It is to the principle of his bills that I shall argue: his means are most ably conceived, and perhaps adequate to the end proposed; it is to the end that I will argue: will it not entail the worst consequences? This apparent arrangement of order and harmony, will it not be subversive of that very freedom, of that very œconomy it is meant to support or introduce? Sir, I may appear
