

dence and general business; and shall act as Librarian and Curator of the Museum unless another officer be specially appointed for those purposes.

XV.—The Council shall have power to call special meetings of the Institution, when they think proper.

XVI.—Admission to the Lectures, Library, and other privileges of the Institution, shall be by ticket, to be furnished by the Treasurer on payment of the fees; the said ticket only to qualify for one year; and persons neglecting to obtain their tickets within twelve months from the commencement of the year, to be

no longer members, unless by re-admission.

XVII.—The Library and Reading Room to be open to all members, subject to the rules to be appointed by the Council. The Lectures to be open to all members, and also to the Public by ticket, on such conditions as the Council shall appoint; each ticket to admit also a lady. The Museum to be open to the Public with no other restriction than personal introduction by a member.

XVIII.—Persons presenting a donation of £10. in money, books, or philosophical apparatus, to be Members for Life.
