

MILITARY BURIAL FOR COL. MATHESON

Late Provincial Treasurer Will Be Laid to Rest in Perth.

SIR JAMES MAY NOT GO

Cabinet Ministers and Parliamentarians From All Canada Will Attend.

Cabinet ministers and members of parliament from all parts of Ontario will attend the funeral this afternoon in Perth of the late Col. the Hon. A. J. Matheson, provincial treasurer.

Out of respect for the late colonel, Sir James Whitney has ordered the parliament buildings to be closed at 1 o'clock today.

Col. Matheson will be given a military funeral. Ever since the Northwest Rebellion in 1866 he was commander of the 42nd Regiment of Perth.

FOUND BY POLICEMAN

Sent a Note to His Wife Telling of His Intentions.

George Sanson, a schoolboy, living at 74 Gerrard st., told the police that he had been promised 50 cents by the man if he would deliver a note at 34 Elm st. He took the message and returned to the church for his money.

The Italian was kneeling at the altar, so he informed Constable McIntosh. Enquiry at 34 Elm st. elicited the information that the injured man's name was Emilio Raffaele.
