CHICAGO, July 14.—Rene Russell, the Texas recruit pitcher of the Chicago Club, was almost invincible today and held the Boston champions to one hit, a single over second by Hooper in the third innings, while he and his team-mates bunched hits off Foster and shut out the visitors, 8 to 0. Russell never was in danger, as only one of Stahl's men reached third base. He walked only one man, hit behind Russell and struck out four. The support got a base on Yeager's error in the fifth. CINCINNATI, July 14.—The National Baseball Commission today remanded and referred to the national board the

cases of five players with directions to adjust the several claims in accordance with the contractual obligations of the interested clubs.

In each case, the players were released after being injured without being given two full weeks' pay, and two weeks' half pay as stipulated in a clause of the contracts between the minor league clubs and the players.
