ERMANY TO HAVE BIG AERIAL FLEET

Giving Attention to All Sorts But Relies Mainly on Dirigible Balloons.

MAY CROSS ATLANTIC

Can Commandeer Airships

All of the so-called private airships in Germany are subject to the requirements of the army and navy and can be commandeered at any time. This is true of all the Zeppelins and also of the nonrigids that are of any considerable size, but not aeroplanes. Germany has no standard type of military aeroplane, but buys indisriminately from private firms. However, there is a "national type" of aeroplane in Germany. Its principal characteristics are unusual flexibility, and the bird-like shape of the wings. The latest Zeppelin is 525 feet long, with at least 500 horse power, and a guaranteed speed of over fifty miles an hour. To build and house such a balloon and equip and man it for a transaliantic voyage, with insurance guaranties, etc., would cost about \$1,500,000. The cost and guaranties in the case of an aeroplane big enough and strong enough to venture on such a voyage are figured at \$250,000, but even experts here do not seriously consider the possibility of an aeroplane flight between Europe and America.

It has been suggested that the best time for an aeroplane to try the transoceanic flight would be in June or July.
