THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL U⁶.

An Act for the relief of Bernard Rivet.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Bernard Rivet, domiciled in Canada and residing at the village of Sanmaur, in the province of Quebec, superintendent, has by his petition alleged that on the third day of May, A.D. 1939, at the city of Montreal, in the said province, he and Elizabeth McKenzie, who was then of the said city, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Bernard Rivet and Elizabeth McKenzie, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Bernard Rivet may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Elizabeth McKenzie had not been solemnized.
