HAVANA, March 8.—A fight for the world's heavyweight pugilistic championship will take place at Havana Saturday, April 3, between Jack Johnson and Jess Willard. The last obstacle in the way of having the fight take place here was removed this afternoon when Jack Johnson, who endeavored to have the men meet at Juarez, Mexico, March 6, received a cable from Willard saying that he would start immediately for Havana, arriving here from New Orleans March 15. The terms for the fight are identical with those which would have prevailed had the encounter taken place at Juarez. Curley will act as the fight promoter and will be assisted by Richard Kiegan, managing director. The fight is expected to be a very close one, but several excellent places are available. Johnson began training today. Willard will probably have training quarters at Marianao.

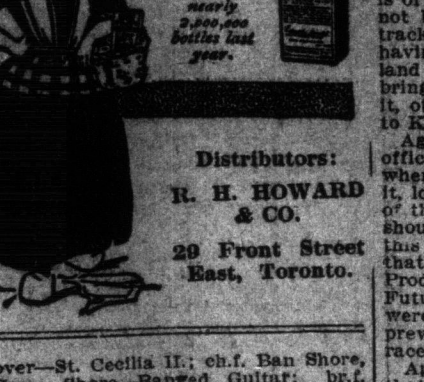

TWO TRACKS WANT
THE RICH FUTURITY

Belmont Park and Saratoga Directors After Big Race—Spa May Drop Two Days.

NEW YORK, March 8.—There is a struggle on between the directors of the Saratoga Racing Association and the directors of the Westchester Racing Association (Belmont Park) to hold the Futurity at their tracks. Ever since the Conny Island Jockey Club (Sheepshead Bay track) closed its gates Saratoga has staged the Futurity—the most valuable horse race in America. The Futurity is a big market of attraction to the racers that the officials of the Belmont Park track now wish to run it off at their course at the fall meeting.

The Belmont officials have raised the contention that inasmuch as the Futurity is of purely local racing interest it should not be run off except at a metropolitan track. The officials also claim that having the race on one of the Long Island tracks the Kentucky turfmen would bring their horses to the track, and otherwise they would ship their horses to Kentucky.

Against this contention the Saratoga officials say that they took the Futurity when no other racing association wanted it, looked after the starters and paid half of the added money (\$50,000), and that they should not be deprived of this race at Saratoga. The Saratoga officials also say that Belmont Park has the Home-Bred Produce Stakes—a race similar to the Futurity—and that if both of these races were run off at Belmont Park it would prevent horses from taking part in each.

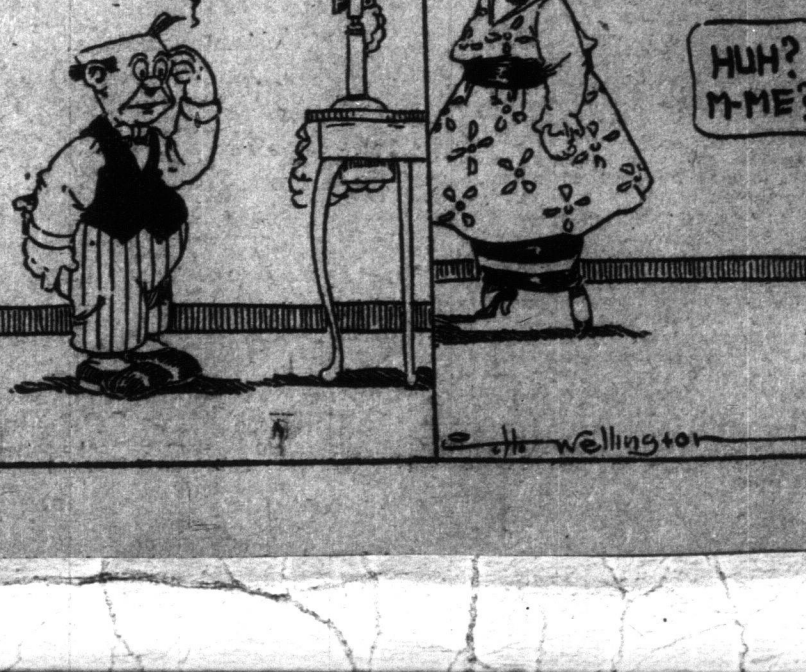
