
## ALEXANDER MACKENZIE TO THE ARCTIC



There are a few heroic souls who scorn ease and search for adventures, dangerous and difficult. Such a man was Alexander Mackenzie who came to Canada from Scotland at the age of sixteen to become a fur trader in the wild Northland. So well had he done his work in the counting house at Montreal that at the age of twenty-one he was made a partner in the North West Fur Company, and later was sent to Lake Athabasea to extend the fur trade. He replaced the famous Peter Pond who quarreled with his friends and killed his rival, the Hudson's Bay factor. Pond is remembered by his map of the land between Hudson Bay and Lake Athabasea, on which he measured the distance by the units of time it took to smoke a pipe on the trail.
