It is their duty, while they are in power to see that the laws which are necessar for carrying on the work of the nation, as properly passed by parliament. Bills introduce at the wish of the government are calle "government measures." They may be brough in either by members of the government them selves or by private members in whom they have confidence. If a government measure does no pass, the government must resign or ask the governor-general to allow a new election to be Therefore, the defeat of a government measure in the House is a very serious matter and hardly ever happens. For the government usually finds out beforehand whether its supporters are willing to allow the bill to pass or not.

But sometimes the members of the government may feel that a certain measure which they desire to bring in, is so important that it must be placed before the House, and yet that it is in danger of being rejected. What they will probably do, will be to endeavour to put this measure, if possible, in such form
