

The Indian treasury hold 18 lacs less rupees than 11 days ago. This reduction is a very small one for the time of year and compares with a decrease of 70 lacs from Nov. 10 to Nov. 24 last. A shipment of £95,000 has been made from San Francisco to Hongkong. The U.S. treasury bought 100,000 ounces on the 5th inst. for coinage purposes; of course being so small it had no effect on the market.
