Racing in Canada Best Ever in 1911 Says Wm. Hendrie

O'Neil Sevier, in New York Telegraph:

William Hendrie of Toronto, who is a member of the Ontario Jockey Club, and a prominent figure in Canadian racing, as his father was before him, came down from the north to attend the dinner of sportsmen at the Waldorf. In an informal way he represented Ontario Jockey Club at that function.

Mr. Hendrie thinks the idea of the sportsmen's dinner a good one. He considers it an excellent scheme for sportsmen of all kinds to act together in a convivial gathering once or twice a year and exchange ideas. He will be glad to accept an invitation to attend another feast next winter.

The father of this sportsman of Ontario was venerated through his long and useful life as the father in Canada, and he merited the appellation. The elder Hendrie was a scientific student of breeding and a staunch supporter of racing. In 1888, while we were in the throes of that terrible struggle with the cruel Spaniards, the elder Mr. Hendrie slipped down here from the frozen north (only it was not frozen at that particular time) and won the rich Futurity stakes with Martmas, a son of Candemas.

Martmas won the Flatbush, too, but the rewards took first money away from him for an alleged fool. That did not matter, though the Futurity brought distinction enough to the Hendries for one season.

They did not care about the money involved in the loss of the Flatbush Furse. Since winning the Futurity Martmas has gone to the stud in Canada, and got many winners for the Hendries. He is a hardy sort. Candemas, sire of Martmas, a son of Hermit and Furse, was a full brother to St. Blaise. Besides Martmas, Candemas got Wak Taper, Irish Lad and Dr. Cartlet.

Mr. Hendrie says that his brother George is wintering twenty horses of various ages, and that ten of them at least will

race next year. The others will be sold off.

In Mr. Hendrie's opinion, racing in Canada next year will be up to the best traditions of the sport over the border.

Racing has won its right, and the Canadian Breeding Bureau, ably conducted by John Ryan, is making the sport and the thoroughbred popular with Dominion folk from Nova Scotia to the British Columbia littoral.

The Canadian Breeding Bureau has placed first-class thoroughbred stallions at the service of farmers of all classes, and Canada is rapidly developing a lot of fine half-breds. The farmers look forward to the day when they may sell the half-bred product of their sturdy native mares to the thoroughbred too well to keep him long in banishment.

Mr. Hendrie is acquainted with much country of the racing situation in this country.

"We want to see the sport regain its old popularity and prestige in New York State," he said. "The better racing you have on this side of the border, the better we will have in Canada. I am sure it will come back, too. The American people like the thoroughbred too well to keep him long in banishment."


