The Montreal Canadiens were the first to score in the first period. Munnery took the eye of the fans. His blocking was up to par. Crawford was closely checked all night. Adams did some effective checking. As usual, Newsy Lalonde was the leader of the Montreal attack. He went in the pinches, passed well, and packed a wicked shot.

The first period saw each club get a goal. Lalonde passed one out from the corner on Cleghorn to the net. Noble cornered it up for the locals by going

alone, crossing over the defence, and beating Vesina from close range. Vesina's shot was better than any he had ever taken. They went at a fast pace, and some high-class hockey was peddled. Skinnert got the first goal from a pass out of the corner, and then Vesina took the lead by coming outside the defence. The Arenas got the next two. Randall scored them both, the first from a three-man combination, and the second from a pass called in tight and passed back. The period ended with the Arenas up 4 to 3, as Lalonde netted one from a pretty three-man combination. The second period was a bit of a rustler's to one in the final round. Some sparkling bits were peddled here. Noble got the first goal when Deenany carried in the puck and he passed it to the net. Randall was the other goal getter.
