Washington, Nov. 21.—The largest crowd  
of the meeting was at the Benning track  
today. The Chevy Chase Steeplechase,  
with gentlemen riders, and the Vestal  
Stakes, were the features. Woolwich,

Does any English authority on Associa-  
tion football know anything about an inter-  
national game to be played between America  
and England in London next April, says The  
Express (London, Eng.).

Football League and arrange all the minor  
details. The match will be played—  
probably at the Crystal Palace ground on  
Friday preceding the final English cup  
match.

The exact date is not known, it will  
be played about April 7.

the news, and said that he had never heard  
of anything of the kind.

Mr. F. J. Wall, the secretary of the Foot-  
ball Association, when seen by an Express  
representative recently, was unable to shed  
any light on the phantom game. In fact,  
he expressed himself rather staggered by  
the news, and said that he
