A JUDGMENT RESTORED.

In Montgomery v. Corbett another conveyance was attached. It was made by defendant Samuel Corbett to his son. The plaintiff eight months after the conveyance obtained a verdict against the father of \$1 damages and \$400 costs. The defence was that the conveyance was simply carrying out a family arrangement. In May v. The absolute success of the operation was just made known after the patient announced that he had had a sensation on his paralyzed hand over the mended nerve.



There is talk of an alleged Mcfropolitan-Manhattan deal, but there is no definite foundation for it apart from the rumor that 140 was offered for control of Manhattan stock. Further important negotiations are said to be on between the Westinghouse and General Electric Companies. More gold is constantly going into the banks and Treasury, the latter gaining about \$1,000,000 to-day. The Standard Oil people have been elected directors of the Brooklyn Union Gas. The dry goods trade is getting into satisfactory shape. Foreign exchange was heavy to-day, closing at 4.85.

There was a good demand for cash wheat both here and at the seaboard, and indications point to much higher prices, as the foreign situation certainly warrants a still greater advance, and our local operators are not alone now on the bull side but the market is broadening and outside speculation is much improved.

Corn—Market opened firm at charter advance, and for a time ruled steady with only a fair trade. Later some of the wheat bulls came on the market and bought quite freely, advancing prices ½c. The strength of the wheat market was the main cause of the advance, light receipts and estimates not having much effect on prices. There is no change to note in the cash situation except that freights are easies is not so urgent. Charters were made for 95,000 bushels.
