and prices for leading issues show a good advance this week.

The business prospects in Manitoba are bright. The recent rains greatly improved it he crops, and that has made the feeling in trade circles very hopeful, with the result that retailers are inclined to make liberal purchases for the fall. Jobbers report a good, steady demand in all lines of seasonable goods at fair prices. Collections are very fair for this time of the year, and there is a larger proportion of cash business being done. There are many new settlers coming in all the time, a large proportion of them being from the States south, and the active demand for farm lands referred to some time ago is being kept up.

Business at the coast is very good. The hardware firms report a good demand for mining outfits, and the provision men are making some good sales. The lumber trade continues active, and considerable shipments are being made in the East. The lumber mills are working 12 hours a day. The flour trade is demoralized and prices are 50c lower.


