Friday Evening, Aug. 19. Farmers' deliveries of new wheat con-tinue very small, and next Monday's sta-tistics are expected to show a decrease for the current week of over 1,000,000 bush-els in the visible supply in Canada and the United States. Nevertheless, with the pros-pects of very large shipments to market later in the season, the market exhibits weakness. On the Chicago board to-day the August delivery receded 1½c, and the September and December options 1½c and ic, respectively. The close was at about bottom quotations.
