HAS THE PERFECT STORAGE BATTERY ARRIVED?

Mr. Edison has given a practical demonstration of his new storage battery. The test seems to have been eminently successful, and it looks as if the much-sought-for storage battery has at length arrived. Mr. Edison had his new battery installed in an electric runabout. The cells to give the vehicle a traveling radius of 75 miles weigh only 260 pounds. They can be charged in one hour for a run of 50 miles. The storage battery on the market to-day has a dead weight of 1800 pounds for each horse power hour. Edison's battery requires that dead weight to 55 pounds. Another feature of the new battery is its indestructibility. It can be charged and recharged without perceptible change in the materials. It is an iron nickel cell, or, in creative pole or negative pole or positive element is iron, and the positive pole or the negative element is nickel. Edison believes he has reached, as far as he can see, the ne plus ultra of the storage battery. He has tested his vehicle on the roughest grades in Morris County, New Jersey, and he states there are none which his runabout could not easily climb. Mr. Edison claims his battery has reached commercial perfection, and he is now setting about to manufacture them for business purposes. He has purchased a factory and will proceed at once to equip it with the necessary plant for manufacturing the cells. Within a reasonable time the article will be on the market. A detailed description of the Edison battery will be of interest to students of electricity and to the hundreds of inventors and mechanics who have been trying to improve the old-time storage battery. The construction of one cell is as follows:

In a steel sheet a number of holes are punched—24, in fact—and in each one of these holes is placed a steel box, this is perforated with minute holes. The active material is made in the form of briquettes, and is contained in these little steel boxes. The briquettes are condensed under a pressure of 8000 lbs., which insures their being absolutely rigid. The positive briquettes are composed of a finely divided compound of iron obtained by a special chemical process, mixed with an equal proportion of graphite. The graphite does not enter into any of the chemical processes, but simply assists the conductivity. The negative briquettes are obtained by similarly mixing finely divided nickel, also obtained by a secret process, with an equal bulk of graphite. This is solidified in the little steel boxes in the case of the iron.

These two plates, one containing 24 of the iron and graphite boxes, and the other 24 of the nickel and graphite boxes, constitute one cell of the battery. Speaking of the invention The Electrical Review says: "Mr. Edison has given the world what promises to be another epoch-making invention. He has produced no invention of broader utility in the electrical field since incandescent lighting was evolved from his brain. The perfected battery means the solution of many difficult traction problems, the betterment of electric lighting and the foundation of the new art of electrical navigation. Electric tugsboats will give new life to our canals, and with electric ferry-boats will revolutionize our harbors."

GOOD MONEY IN LIVE STOCK.

If the farmers of Canada are not making money now it is their own fault. The demand for live stock of all kinds is very active and prices range exceptionally high. With hogs selling at \$7.25 per cwt., there ought to be a fine profit in raising pigs. The country has been scouring for high-grade horses with the result that there are now not enough animals to supply the demand for horses of the right type. For some time past business in the Toronto Cattle Market has been brisk and good prices have been realized for all grades of cattle. The prices yesterday ranged from \$3.50 to \$5.25 per cwt. The reputation of Ontario as a breeder of high-grade cattle is extending every year. We now make frequent shipments of our best stock to Manitoba, British Columbia, the United States, South America and other distant points. The Farming World advises the farmer who is not engaged in some department of the live stock industry to get into line right away. He can find no work about the farm that will pay him better than the raising of horses, cattle, sheep or hogs. No matter which he goes in for there is money in the business if he will only conduct it on intelligent lines. The up-to-date farmer no longer grows cereals for the market. He raises grain as the raw material for producing a more highly finished article. He is becoming a manufacturer as well as a farmer. We agree with The Farming World that the present activity in farming is not a mere transitory one, "but is characterized by a degree of permanency which we believe will make it the front as a money-making business for many years to come in this country."

EAST BLOOR-STREET PAVEMENT.

A prominent citizen writes to The World: "Have you been mesmerized? If not, why don't you pitch into the city for the disastrous condition of the East Bloor-street pavement, east of Yonge-street? It has been dangerous for man and beast, as well as bicycle, ever since the snow went away. It is the duty of the city to keep it in repair, and it should be repaired with asphalt throughout; the patching that is done periodically is a useless waste of money. The World recalls that a year ago or more it directed attention to this street and the fact that it seemed to be the worst piece of work in the town. It was then patched as our correspondent says. But it must be done all over. What have the city authorities to say about it?"

CHICAGO'S OCEAN FLEET.

MACKENZIE & MANN CLAIM

The Premier Made a Statement in the House as to the Compensation Due the Firm

ON YUKON RAILWAY CONTRACT.

Supply Bill Passed—Fault-Finding About an Overplus of Oratory in the House.

Ottawa, May 23.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier this morning laid upon the table of the House the papers connected with the Mackenzie & Mann claim for compensation in connection with their contract for the Yukon Railway. Sir Wilfrid said: "As I explained at a former sitting of the House that I would present this claim and make at the same time a statement concerning it, I beg to say that Messrs. Mackenzie & Mann have presented their claim on equitable grounds to be recouped the expenditure they were led to incur in consequence of having entered into a contract with the Government to build the railway in the Yukon. Their claim as presented at first amounted to \$50,000. It has been reduced from time to time. Two hundred thousand dollars have been taken off for the saving these gentlemen were able to make by using the material in their work. There are still some further deductions to be made. There is one part of the claim which will be to be deducted, namely, their claim of 15 per cent. profit on the expenditure. If their claim is to be considered on an equitable ground, this, of course, cannot be allowed. But before coming to any conclusion the Government should consider that the matter should first be subjected to a judicial audit."

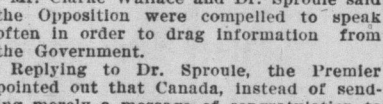

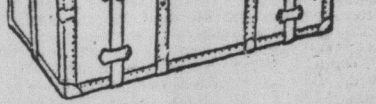

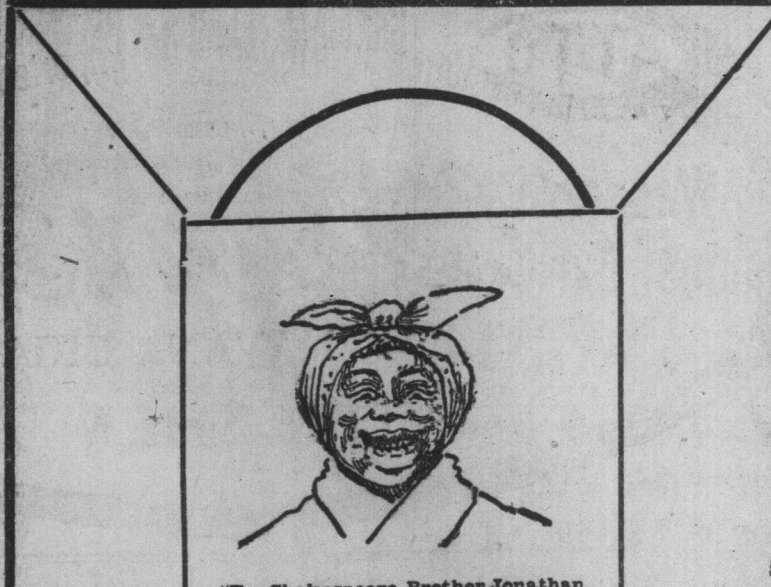
