



WITH THE CHANGE OF DATE NEW YORK, Dec. 25.-Alfred Shrubh, the English professional, who is expected to run Tom Longboat a Marathon race in the garden on Jan. 28, arrived here from Boston to-day, not altogether pleased with the arrangement. "I don't know why Longboat should be allowed to dictate the terms," said Shrubb. "I see no reason for a postpone-ment from Jan. 8 or 9 to Jan. 28. I am tired of all this delay. If Longboat does not want to meet me, why doesn't he say so? I have tried for nearly a year to have him run me from five to fifteen miles, but he has held off for a Zo-mile event. Now, when I have consented to race him 28 miles and 35 yards, he makes an excuse and wants a postponement. "I want to meet Longboat before I go back to England, but I want fair treat-mot stand too much training.
