TRADE IN CANADA. Provincial Elections in Quebec and Yarni Uncertainty Have Depressed It.

General trade at Montreal has been checked by the Provincial elections, and tariff changes have demoralized prices of some articles of Canadian manufacture.

There is a fair trade with Toronto wholesale dealers in dry goods and groceries, the latter going in lifting camps at the North West. Ontario farmers are busy seeding.

Bank clearing at Winnipeg, Hamilton, Toronto, Montreal and Halifax, aggregate \$22,267,341, compared with \$21,212,000 last week and with \$20,657,000 in the week a year ago. There are 31 failures reported from the Dominion of Canada this week.
