Berlin, May 11 .- The political prisoners confined at Schlusselburg, near St. Petersburg, have smuggled out of the fortress an appeal addressed to the foreign press, in the hope that if publicity is given to their sufferings an inquiry will be ordered from high quarters, with the result that their lot

will be ameliorated. A copy of the appeal has been recelved here. It affects to be written on behalf of 73 political prisoners, six of whom are women. They say that their hands and feet are chained day,

and night, and that they are given no food but bread and water. The appeal narrates that not long ago the fortress was visited by the director of Russian prisons administration. One of the prisoners, named Spiransky, refused to stand up when the director entered his cell and was ordered fifty lashes with the knout.
