

ECLIPSES FOR THE YEAR 1841.

There will be four Eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon, during the year 1841; but only one will be visible in Nova-Scotia.

1st. A partial Eclipse of the Sun on January 22nd, visible only in a small part of the Southern Ocean.

2nd. A total Eclipse of the Moon, on February 5th, and visible as follows:

First contact with Penumbra	- -	7h 8"	} Mean time in the evening at Halifax.
do with dark Shadow	- -	8 6	
First total Immersion	- -	9 3	
Middle of Eclipse	- -	9 52	
Last total immersion	- -	10 41	
Last contact with dark shadow	- -	11 48	} morn. of 6th.
do with Penumbra	- -	0 45	

3rd. A partial Eclipse of the Sun on February 21st, visible only in the North Atlantic Ocean, Iceland, and part of Greenland.

4th. A partial Eclipse of the Sun on July 18th, but invisible in Nova-Scotia.

5th. A total Eclipse of the Moon on August 2nd, invisible in Nova-Scotia.

6th. A partial Eclipse of the Sun on August 16th, visible only in the Southern Ocean and South Pacific Ocean.
