Cottons.

On manufactures of, viz., Grey or unbleached and bleached cottons, sheetings, drills, ducks, cotton, or Canton flannels not stained, painted or printed, one cent per square yard, and 15 per cent. <i>ad valorem</i> .
Cotton jeans, denims, drillings, bed tickings, gingham, plaids, cotton, or Canton flannels, ducks and drills, dyed or coloured, cottonades, pantaloons stuffs, and goods of like description, 2 cents per square yard and 15 per cent. <i>ad valorem</i> .
Cotton wadding, batting, batts, and warps, carpet warps, knitting yarn, hosiery yarn or other cotton yarns under number 40, not bleached, dyed or coloured, 2 cents per pound and 15 per cent. <i>ad valorem</i> .
Ditto, if bleached, dyed or coloured, 3 cents per pound and 15 per cent. <i>ad valorem</i> .
On cotton warps or beams, one cent per yard and 15 per cent. <i>ad valorem</i> .
On cotton seamless bags, 2 cents per lb. and 15 per cent. <i>ad valorem</i> .
On cotton shirts and drawers, woven or made on frames, and on all cotton hosiery, <i>ad valorem</i>30 per cent
Clothing made of cotton, or of which cotton is the component part of chief value, <i>ad valorem</i> , including corsets
Cotton Sewing Thread in hanks, <i>ad valorem</i>12½ per cent
—On spools, <i>ad valorem</i>20 per cent
