**FLEET STREET HAS PECULIAR CHARM**  
Characters Out of Dickens  
Seem to Populate Famous Old Thoroughfare Still.  
(Christian Science Monitor.)  
The attraction of Fleet street for those who work in it and live in it is peculiar and intimate. In this respect it is perhaps different from any other street in the world. Its call to the exile is as strong as the call of his native village to the countryman; as the bond that unites the banished Scotman to his own land. The difference between the street eastward of Ludgate Circus and westward of the Griffin, where Temple Bar used to stand, would not, possibly, be recognized by the average passerby, but there is a difference. Old landmarks are constantly disappearing with the street widening, improvements, and so forth, but the people, the real community, of the place, are changeless and characteristic. No where else do you find such a curious mingling of past and present. Adopt Dr. Johnson's proposal and take a walk down Fleet street. You will meet faces that have been familiar there for the last quarter of a century, or more, if your memory goes back so far.  
On a fine day you are almost sure to encounter the spruce, upright figure of Mr. Wardle. He frequently met Dickens as his father's house when he was a boy. The senior Wardle and the now-dead Mr. Wardle were great cronies during the father's Fleet street days, and it was this Wardle who gave Box the name for the jovial master of Dineley Dell. Knowing the son, it is easy to imagine that he supplied something more than the name for the estimable man who was such a good friend of the Pickwickians. There is a briskness about the present-day Mr. Wardle, such a happy twinkle in his clear eyes, combined with a kindly, old-world courtesy, that he puts every man in good humor and makes every man his friend.  
Kitty, the flower girl, is another familiar figure in the street. Kitty, with an armful of carnations, roses, or chrysanthemums, the best to be found in London, brings a breath of a cleaner
