
A PECULIAR POSITION. Mr. Baxter says in his testimony that while these tenders were called for on a mileage basis in December 1915, at the instance of the provincial govern-ment, the government had no intention of accepting any tender at that time or of proceeding with the work. He says the call was made to indicate to Mr. Cochrane, who was then minister of railways at Ottawa, that the provincial government intended to go ahead with the work, whether Cochrane was will-ing or not. IF MR. BAXTER IS CORRECT, HE IS IN A MOST PECU-LIAR SITUATION, NAMELY THAT OF A PUBLIC MAN ACKNOWL-EDGING THAT HE CALLED TENDERS FOR A LARGE CONTRACT: THAT HE WAS THE OCCASION OF BUSINESS MEN GOING TO LARGE EXPENSE AND SPENDING MUCH TIME IN PREPARING TENDERS, WHEN IT NEVER WAS THE INTENTION TO ACCEPT ANY OF THEM. This insincerety of the government must 'have become known to some of the firms who took the trouble to examine the route of the proposed railway and submitted tenders on a mileage basis, because when ten-ders were alterwards called for on the unit' basis, no bona fide tender what-ever was received.




