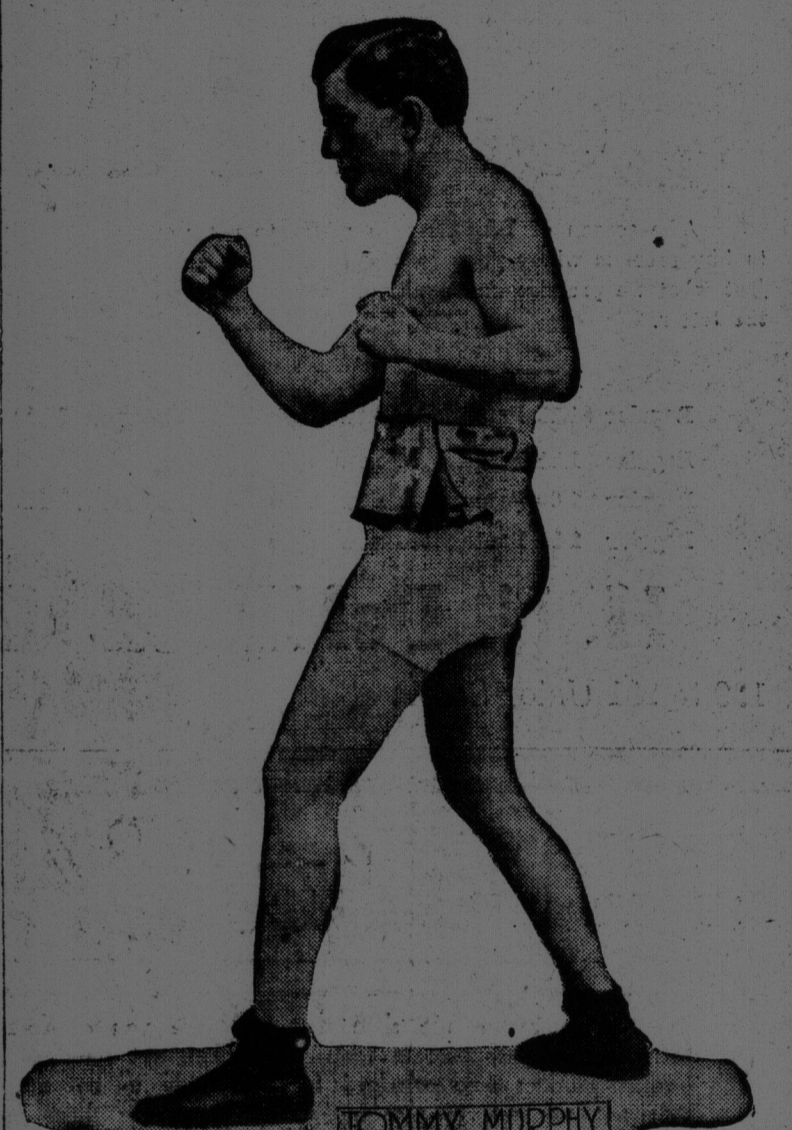

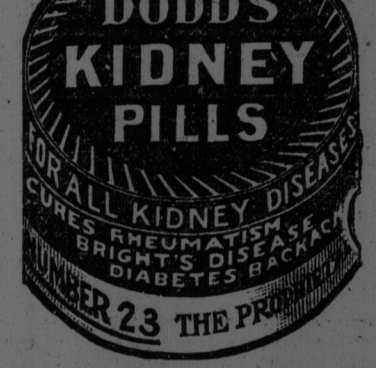

England's steeplechase classic, the Grand National Handicap, may be won by an American owner, horse and jockey, John R. Fell, of Philadelphia owns Highbridge, an American jockey, now in France, to ride his horse in the big race. Williams is under contract to Charles Kohler, a New York horseman, and during the recent Vice meeting and other meetings in France has ridden numerous winners. He formerly rode the Weikins for I. M. Parr and other horses owned by the same party. He is regarded as the best American cross-country jockey now in France.

There is much interest in and about the English race. Mr. Fell will sail on Feb. 15 on the White Star liner, though Highbridge, considered the best cross-country horse in America, was really a gift horse from St. P. Randolph to his son-in-law, Mr. Fell. His new owner rode him as a two-year-old at horse shows and took numerous prizes with him. Though being trained at Newmarket by an English trainer, Highbridge is never out of sight of his handler, James Frayling, who practically lives in the horse's stable. It is Mr. Fell's intention to race Highbridge in two or three races prior to the big event.

To Race in Province. Dave Warman, Providence trainer, who races Aloys, Bugosa and other fast ones here last summer, is the first New England trainer to announce himself as ready to make an early campaign in the maritime provinces this year. The Boston Globe says: "Dave Warman is wintering a dozen head at Narragansett including Lady Hal, 2:14 1/4, the half-sister to Frank Bogash, Jr.; Foxey Jane, 2:11 1/4; Cochocho Boy, by Cochocho Joe Patchen, Jr.; Leona K., a granddaughter of Moko; a three-year-old by Cochocho and Silk Spier, 2:19 3/4.
