BREACH OF PROMISE

SUIT BRINGS \$500
FROM WEALTHY MAN

Elderly Irish Farmer Had Strange
Ways of Conducting His Court-
ship—Recent Heir to Quarter
Million

Dublin, March 7.—An action for breach
of promise of marriage against an elderly
retired farmer, Patrick Duggan, of Dublin,
who had received a legacy of close on \$250,000
was heard in the Irish Law Courts.
The defendant is between sixty and sev-
enty years of age, and the plaintiff, Miss
Emily Sheerin, a governess, is thirty-one.
In cross-examination, she said she knew
the defendant had filled her water, but
thought it was her sister's fault because
she asked for a settlement.
Counsel for the defence declared that
the object of the action was to extort
money, and nothing else. "Having failed
with Lizzy, they tried to impose Emily
on the defendant."
On cross-examination the defendant said
he was married on January 7, his wife be-
ing twenty-three years old.
Mr. Justice Wright (in surprise): Is he
married? That is the first I have heard
of it.
The defendant said he proposed to his
wife by writing to her mother and was
married a week afterwards.
Counsel—"And you did not know her
Christian name?"
"She had two daughters, and I said it
was the tallest I wanted."

New York, March 7.—Mrs. Ida Tarr,
mother of Jersey City, whose daughter, Salome,
looked down the democratic presidential nom-
inee, Governor Woodrow Wilson made when he

sued the Drake Business College for
\$25,000, because that concern was
so pleased over the work of its graduate
that, without her permission, it displayed
her photograph on bill boards and in
street cars, newspapers, magazines and
clubs in advertising its system of instruc-
tion.
