THE FIRST DUTY

The announcement that the Shipping Federation has threatened to cancel all steamship sailings from the port of St. John until December 31 is, of course, a serious matter, but the dispute between the Federation and the longshoremen is a subject for negotiation, and perhaps arbitration, and must not be permitted to distract public attention from the mission of the St. John delegation this week to Ottawa.

The St. John delegation had hoped to get through with their business at Montreal yesterday, but were further delayed, as it was not convenient to secure an interview with Sir Thomas Shaughnessy until today. The outlook is not very promising at the moment, and the citizens will await with a great deal of interest the public meeting to be held on Monday evening.

Enough is known about the special rates granted to the C. P. R. for trains hauling freight and passengers between St. John and Halifax to make it clear that the government railway has been used to discriminate against the port of St. John.

The Hon. J. D. Hazen should be one of the speakers at the public meeting on Monday evening. The City Improvement League of Halifax have secured the services of "tree surgeons" from Montreal to treat the trees in the Province Building Square in Halifax.

The Ulster Liberals have at last taken note of the activities of Sir Edward Carson. They have issued a manifesto declaring that they will not recognize any provisional government, and will expect the forces of the Empire to defend their liberties, which are imperilled by "the anarchist movement led by Sir Edward Carson."

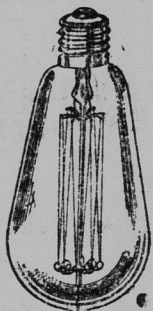

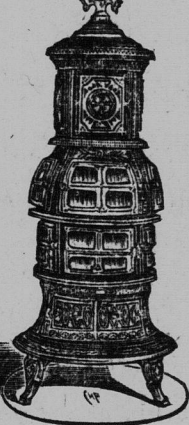

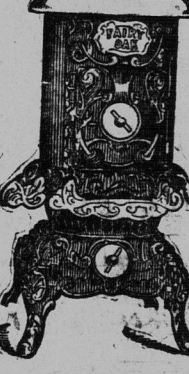
